



In his book 'The Five Love Languages' author, Gary Chapman, has shed light on the fact that human beings give and receive love in five basic ways. Every human being has a preferred way that works best for them. Actually, if we show them love using a different language then they are unlikely to understand that love is being shown. If we discover our child's love language, then that will provide us with the key to motivate them, as that's the way they will respond to best.

The Five Love Languages are:

Words of Affirmation

Actions speak louder than words and if this is your child's love language then genuine, heartfelt compliments and words of encouragement, mean the world to them.

Quality Time

For these children, nothing says I love you more than giving your child your undivided attention. Being able to be fully present and really listen and show interest in them.

Receiving Gifts

This does not mean over indulgence in material 'things' but rather the love and thoughtfulness behind the gift which means the most to these children.

Acts of Service

The words that these children love to hear are, "Let me help you/do that with you." Helping your child with a school project or helping them clean their room would mean the world to these children.

Physical Touch

Hugs, pats on the back, thoughtful touches on the arm speak volumes to these children with this love language. I am sure that if you think for a moment you are likely to be able to recognize the main love language of your child. You can sit down together with your child and do the quiz together on the following website. <https://www.5lovelanguages.com/profile/>

When you want to motivate your child, then think in terms of their love language. Try incorporating their love language when you want to communicate your wish. Tousle their hair as you ask them to do their homework, as you give them their favourite afternoon tea. Spend some time hearing about their day, after telling them how impressed you are with them, or just after you have helped them with something. Your request will be heard whilst they are in a positive mood and feeling loved and therefore they are more likely to do as you ask. Longer term, continuing to show them love using their preferred love language, will strengthen and enhance your relationship.


